Safeguarding Alerts

What are Safeguarding Alerts?

Safeguarding Alerts are alerts that are added to Oasis in respect of the following categories: -

Children’s Alerts

- Looked after Children (both current and historic)
- Children subject to, and have previously been on a Child Protection Plan (CPP)
- Children at risk of FGM
- Children at risk/victim of CSE
- Pregnant mother’s who’s baby will be subject to a CPP
- Children at risk of domestic violence

Adult Alerts

- Vulnerable adult
- High risk patient
- Patient who poses a risk of harm (whether sexual or physical) to others
- Risk of domestic violence
- Patients discussed at MARAC

Whose responsibility is it to add the alert?

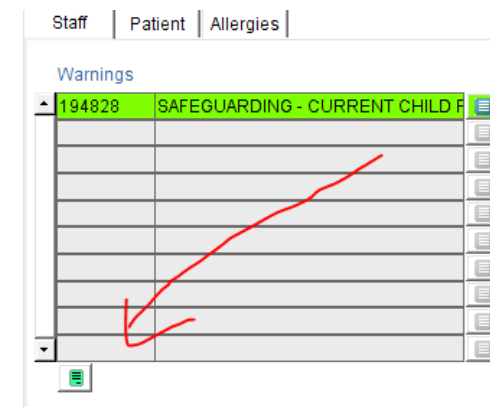
The Integrated Safeguarding Team should be the only people who add Safeguarding Alerts. If you have a query or are aware of an alert which need to be added please contact Safeguarding on ext 33735 or email (address overleaf)

Alerts are put on Oasis, how will this present if I look on other clinical systems?

Oasis is the “Mothership” of clinical systems and this feeds the alert to all other systems such as Patient First, Bluespир, EZNotes.

I can only see there is an alert. How do I find out more information?

The Alert that is put on Oasis is generic, i.e. “*Current Child Protection Plan*” – to obtain further information such as the category the plan is for, name of social worker and how long the patient has been on the plan is found within the narrative box. This is a green notepad style icon situation at the bottom left hand side of the page:

Domestic Abuse/MARAC ALERT

When the Safeguarding Team get notification from the police that a domestic incident has taken place, the Safeguarding Team flags the victim and any children at risk. Similarly, when a patient is discussed at MARAC the patient and children at risk are also flagged.

The alert is “Safeguarding – risk of Domestic Abuse/MARAC” – practitioners must open the narrative to establish whether the patient has been either discussed at MARAC or whether the alert relates to a police log being received.

Whose responsibility is it to check alerts?

Any clinical member of staff involved in the care of the patient has a responsibility to check if there are any alerts on the system in relation to the patient.

Please remember to hand over to any other clinician/ward department any known alerts as part of the hand over process.
